26C Primary duty

(1) Each party in the chain of responsibility for a heavy vehicle must ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety of the party's transport activities relating to the vehicle.

Primary safety duty

Chain of responsibility party

Ensure safety of transport activities

So far as is reasonably practicable

Eliminate and then minimise public risks

Not directly or indirectly cause or encourage truck drivers to breach the HVNL or speed Not directly or indirectly cause or encourage another person to breach the HVNL



(ii) to carry out another activity associated with the use of the vehicle (such as maintaining or repairing the vehicle);

or

Transport activities

Business practices and making decisions, associated with the use of a heavy vehicle on a road, including contracting, directing or employing a person

drive the vehicle

carry out another activity associated with the use of the vehicle (such as maintaining or repairing the vehicle)



reasonably practicable, in relation to a duty, means that which is, or was at a particular time, reasonably able to be done in relation to the duty, weighing up all relevant matters, including—

Reasonably practicable

safety risk or road infrastructure damage occurring	Degree of harm or damage	The risk or damage	Available ways to remove or minimise it	The cost and whether it is grossly out of line



26D Duty of executive of legal entity

(1) If a legal entity has a duty under section 26C, an executive of the legal entity must exercise due diligence to ensure the legal entity complies with the duty.

Executive due diligence

Who is an executive?

Corporation	Unincorporated partnership	Unincorporated body
A director Any person who is concerned or takes part in the management of the corporation	A partner in the partnership	Management member of the body



Elements of due diligence

Know and understand	Safe conduct of transport activities Nature of the business's transport activities Hazards and risks involved
Lead	 Appropriate resources Processes to: Eliminate or minimise hazards or risks Receive, consider and action new information Comply with primary safety duty
Verify	Resources and processes are being provided, used and implemented.



Truckie law implication driving the wrong way

"It runs completely counter to the well-established principle of criminal law that a person remains innocent until they are proven guilty, without any proof of personal complicity or wrong-doing.

"Reversal of the onus of the proof is inappropriate, contrary to fundamental tenets of our legal system and unfairly discriminates against corporate officers.

> Penalties and burden of proof

Breach	Maximum penalty		
	Corporations	Individuals	
Engages in conduct without a reasonable excuse related to the duty that exposes an individual to a risk of death or serious injury or illness; and is reckless as to the risk	\$3 million	\$300,000 or five years' jail or both	
Contravenes the primary duty and the contravention exposes an individual or class of individuals to a risk of death or serious injury or illness	\$1.5 million	\$150,000	
Contravenes the primary duty	\$500,000	\$50,000	




